Council Notes;

1. There is currently 1.5 million 16 and 17 year olds that are denied a vote in public elections in the UK.

2. The votes at 16 campaign to lower the voting age is supported by thousands of young people across the UK and the Votes at 16 Coalition consists of a wide range of youth and democracy organisation

3. Voting turnout for 18-24 year olds currently sits at 15%, 70+ 80%

Council Believes;

16 and 17 year olds are knowledgeable and passionate about the world in which they live in and are as capable of engaging in the democratic system as any other citizens
 Lowering the voting age to 16 would empower young people to be better engaged in society and influence decisions that will define their future

3. People who can consent to medical treatment, work full time, pay taxes, get married or enter a civil partnership and join the armed forces should have the right to vote
4. Lowering the voting age will also help potential new students understand the importance of Union based elections and help increase voter turnout in all elections

Council resolves;

1. To join the Votes at 16 Coalition

2. To write to Jeremy Lafroy, Tristham Hunt, other local MPs and local media to inform them of this decision and ask them to support the campaign
